Although our plans to reopen our learning centers in Fresno and Hanford with students on-site receiving full academic services were altered once again in July, our commitment to providing students with high-quality instruction/support will continue. We will continue to follow CDC and governmental guidelines for the safe transition of our students back at their respective learning center through the implementation of these plans.

Our program's stakeholders (students, parents/guardians, and staff) are very important to us-and from your input/feedback, a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (LCP) was recently created. This plan will ensure that each and every student is supported academically and social-emotionally. Moreover, teachers & support staff will be provided with a safe environment to instruct, as well as to receive training to provide the best teaching possible. The following guarantees are outlined in the LCP:

- Consistent delivery platform for instruction
- Consistent weekly schedule
- Established teacher, counselor, and support staff availability
- Regular and Consistent Communication
- Weekly Instruction & Labs/Classes
- Academic & Guidance Counseling Support

WPCA's Extended Home Learning is the school's opening transition plan to meet CDC and governmental guidelines. This plan ensures that each student has access and equity to adopted core and supplemental print and digital curriculum, a device (i.e. Chromebook), as well as weekly instruction provided by their respective independent study teacher. Instructional and support staff will ensure that the continuity of learning takes place through consistent and ongoing progress monitoring of each student's academic needs/progress.

The LCP also ensures that students who require additional accommodations are supported- this includes: students with exceptional needs, students with diverse learning needs, Foster Youth, Homeless Youth, students who are medically fragile, students from low-socioeconomic households, and English Language Learners.

As we navigate our way through these uncertain times, our partnership is more important than ever. Communication amongst the school, parents/guardians, and students will play a vital role. WPCA staff members will make every effort to support your needs at home while working through Extended Home Learning. Independent study (I.S.) would continue for all students enrolled at WPCA, with students attending weekly on-site appointments with their teacher, and any on-site labs/classes. Little to no vetting/safeguards required (i.e. no temperature checks, masks/face coverings, etc.) Students would have the option to spend time completing work and/or getting help at school, or at home. Students' completed work per learning period would continue generating attendance.	Independent study (I.S.) would continue for all students enrolled at WPCA, with students attending weekly on-site appointments with their teacher, and any on-site labs/classes. 



VI. Plan C: Extended Home Learning Details

EXTENDED HOME LEARNING FOR ALL WPCA STUDENTS (Grades K-12)

- Weekly instructional appointments with teachers via online platform (Zoom and/or Google Meet)
- Teacher and support staff available to parents/guardians and students Monday-Friday during normal business hours
- A consistent weekly instructional appointment & lab/class schedule for students
- Consistent tools/resources for instruction and progress monitoring
- Households will be assigned a Chromebook (and WiFi hotspot if needed)
- Attendance will continue to be generated through students' completed homework/assignments in a given learning period (per Independent Study regulations)
- Students' homework/assignments will be graded and will count just as during a "normal" school year (for grades and credits)
- Students will be assigned to an Independent Study teacher at the start of the school year (or when they enroll at WPCA)
- Tutorial support will be offered to students online via Zoom and/or Google Meet or by phone
- Students' homework/assignments will be textbook and online platform-based
 - All students will have access to adopted core & supplemental textbooks and online platforms



VII. Roles in Supporting Extended Home Learning

STUDENTS

- Dedicate appropriate time for learning and completing homework/assignments, based on recommendations or as guided by your teacher(s).
- Check your Gmail account for information on classes, assignments, resources daily.
- Ensure that you know your usernames and passwords for the various online platforms and instructional resources. Your teacher will help you with this.
- Set-up a comfortable and quiet space to learn and study at home.
- Engage in online learning activities being offered by your teachers and/or provided through online resources.
- Submit all assignments by due dates established by your teacher(s).
- Communicate with your parents/guardians regarding daily/weekly expectations and assignments.

TEACHERS

- Develop high quality distance learning lessons/assignments for students that address grade-level & course standards/benchmarks while balancing online learning, volume of work assigned, and student/teacher interaction.
- Provide weekly contact and virtual instruction to each student.
- Provide assignments for each student for each week or by learning period.
- Use strategies for English Learners and provide appropriate accommodations for Special Education students with Individualized Education Plans (IEP) and Section 504 plans, to the extent feasible.
- Provide ways to communicate with and provide feedback to students, facilitate live and pre-recorded lessons, and answer student questions.
- Provide instructional resources and materials through Gmail and/or Google Classroom or best means for family.
- Invite parents/guardians to monitor students' progress in completing assignments and current grades (in each subject and/or course).
- Communicate regularly with parents and families regarding expectations and student progress; if students are not engaged in the lessons and assignments, teachers should contact parents and/or the school counselor/administrator.
- Participate in professional development and virtual learning sessions intended to support distance learning, as applicable.



FAMILIES

- Inform your student's teacher regarding any updates in contact information (address, phone number, email address)
- Assure that a mobile device (cell phone) and internet access are available at home. Chromebooks will be distributed to each student at the start of the school year. Contact your school site if there is a need for internet access for at-home use.
- Monitor District communications on WPESD's website (<u>www.westpark.k12.ca.us</u>) and Parent Square for up-to-date information regarding school closures, instructional continuation plans, and on-line learning resources. Please make sure this email address is in your "approved senders" list in your email program. Visit the District website (<u>www.westpark.k12.ca.us</u>) for resources and up-to-date information on on-line learning.
- Ensure that your children know their usernames and passwords for the necessary online platforms and instructional resources; encourage their participation in online learning offerings.
- Ensure that your child practices good digital citizenship (shows respect to teachers, classmates, and others online).
- Maintain communication with your children's teachers and school counselor/site administrator.
- Engage your children in conversations regarding homework/assignments, assessments, and progress/performance.
- Create a dedicated learning space for your student(s) to participate in their weekly instructional appointments, labs/classes, and complete assignments.
- Monitor student time spent engaging in online and offline learning.
- Support your children's emotional balance by providing time for physical activity and play.
